New committee starts work: The school conference

Since October 2024, the newly founded school conference has been meeting, in which pupils, parents and staff discuss school issues together. The committee was set up to bring all stakeholders together at one table for the first time. Four meetings are planned per school year.

The first two meetings focused on the mobile phone policy and the break bell, among other things. It was decided to abolish the mobile phone zone and to conduct a pupil survey on the break bell. Ideas were also collected to promote student engagement and respectful behaviour.

At the end of the school year, it will be evaluated whether the school conference should be continued and further developed.



My child is sick - what should I do?



If a student falls ill or is unable to attend lessons or school events for other reasons, the school must be informed **immediately** or by **8:00 am at the latest** via the current school administration software (Phidias).

Regulations according to school level

KiBi & primary school:

• There is no obligation to provide a medical certificate, not even in the case of prolonged illness. If a doctor's certificate is available, it can be uploaded together with the sick note in Phidias.

Secondary school:

- **Grades 5-9**: No medical certificate required (as in primary school). If a doctor's certificate is available, it can also be uploaded to Phidias. In special cases, the school has the right to request a medical certificate.
- **From year 10 onwards**: a medical certificate is required from the third day of absence, for announced performance reviews and for absences immediately before or after the holidays.

Important information on reporting sick

- **KiBi**: Sick notes must be submitted directly to the respective group via Teams by 8.00 a.m. at the latest.
- **Primary & Secondary School**: Sick notes must be submitted exclusively via Phidias. Students can report sick there for a single day as well as for longer periods of time.

The school medical examinations started in January 2025. Your child/children will be examined by our school doctor Dr Gelderblom.

SAVE THE DATE: Cinema experience at the iDSB on 26.03.



The Head of the State Chancellery and Minister for Culture of Saxony-Anhalt, Rainer Robra, cordially invites you to two film screenings at the International German School Brussels on **26 March 2025**. The films will be shown in the **Aula** of the iDSB.

In the afternoon from **15:45 h** the children's film *Sieger sein* (recommended from 4th grade) will be shown. Mona, a refugee from Syria with her Kurdish family, struggles with the language as a new pupil in a chaotic Berlin school - but her football talent catches the eye. When she is accepted into the girls' team, she learns that success is only possible as part of a team.

In the evening, starting at **19:15 h**, there is a sensitive film *Treasure - Familie ist ein fremdes Land*, which inspires with humour and depth. After the fall of the Iron Curtain, New York businesswoman Ruth travels to Poland to come to terms with her family's past. At her side is her father Edek, who also survived the Holocaust. Their journey becomes a search for themselves and for shared

memories.

After both films, you will have the opportunity to ask the directors questions.

Report on the strategy meeting of the Executive Board

On Sunday, 9 February, the Board of Directors met for a strategy meeting to set the course for the future of the school. A key topic was how to deal with the growing financial challenges. Despite the school association's currently solid financial situation, it is important for the Board of Directors to plan ahead and prepare for possible developments - particularly with regard to the planned closure of the Audi plant in Brussels and potential changes to federal funding.

For the coming school year, it is planned that school fees will not rise significantly above the current inflation rate (3-4%).

Another focus of the meeting was the further development of our school buildings:

- Classrooms in the OS: In summer 2025, ideally before the start of the coming school year, the second floor of the secondary school is to be made usable again with a new escape staircase. This will allow the containers to be decommissioned.
- **Refurbishment of the primary school**: A fundamental repair of the roof of the primary school building (crèche) is planned in the near future.
- Secondary school sports field: Due to its poor condition, the sports field will be modernised in the summer.
- Future of the school buildings: At the end of March, a delegation of German authorities will visit the school to check whether it makes economic sense to renovate the existing buildings or whether a new building will be necessary after all.

As the owner of the property, the federal government will finance the emergency staircase and the roof renovation - the school association's budget remains unaffected.

We will keep you informed of further developments and thank you for your support.
